### The Thanksgiving Story

is basically the story of the Pilgrims and their thankful community feast. The Pilgrims set ground at Plymouth Rock on December 11, 1620. Their first winter was devastating. At the beginning of the following fall, they had lost 46 of the original 102 who sailed on the Mayflower. But the harvest of 1621 was a bountiful one. The remaining colonists decided to celebrate with a feast including 91 Indians who helped the Pilgrims survive the first year. The feast was more of a traditional English harvest festival and lasted three days. Governor William Bradford sent "four men fowling" after wild ducks and geese. It is not certain that wild turkey was part of the feast but it is certain they had venison.
