ETHNICITY AND POLITICS: THE HUNGARIAN EXPERIENCE IN CLEVELAND (continued) by Dennis Frigyes Fredricks

Much of the Hungarian-American political stir in the 1970's was caused by an entirely different group of Hungarians, the post-war arrivals. Coming to Cleveland after the Second World War and the Revolution of 1956, these immigrants largely settled on Cleveland's west side and established their own organizations. Their political activity was limited to campaign year dinners for Republican officials such as Ralph J. Perk and George V. Voinovich. No one from the ranks of these Hungarians has been thus far elected to public office.

IN RETROSPECT

In its proper perspective, the Hungarian-American political experience in Cleveland, Ohio, is a story that deserves a special telling. It is a story that needs to be told to fill in a missing piece in the oft-told tale of the American mosaic.

Volumes of literature have been written and read on the brilliant rise of such earlier arrivals as the Irish, the Italians, the Jews and the Blacks. Their stories have been memorialized in textbooks, fiction, television and the movies. Little has been said yet about the invisible minority, the Eastern and Southern European ethnics who in their individual groups, are smaller, and began their rise later. They too had obstacles to overcome.

The Cleveland Hungarians triumphed over the immigrant syndrome. Drawn here in the 1870's to walk streets paved with gold, they found themselves strangers to the language and customs. They began the American Dream in factories, mines and railroad yards. In two generations they were a leading political force in Cleveland.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We turn to all of you (members, friends, and participants) in love, trust, and need. For a number of years, we have been striving to keep our congregation afloat as well as to protect it.

A couple of years ago, we were able to repair the main roof of the church. We are thankful that our dear and blessed church, the Lord's house, where our Dear Father talks to us was able to be refurbished. We have been able to continue to talk to Him as well and have with great love provided funds to maintain this House of God.

In the meantime, the flat roof has continued to deteriorate and has reached the point where major repairs are necessary for this part of the roof, too. Members of the Council and persons more knowledgeable in these matters went onto the roof to inspect the damage and to see what must be done. The problems center on the roof over the school and upper meeting room. From there, the water leaks into the ceiling of the church hall where it leaves puddles when it rains. Water has completely soaked the ceiling of the church hall which, in turn, has raised the tiles on the floor of the upstairs meeting rooms.

The necessary repairs are estimated to require approximately \$10,000. We are asking for your help, once again, so that we can begin repairs now to enable as much as possible of the work to be completed by September when the church calendar gets busy with dinners, Hungarian school, literary programs, meetings, and rehearsals.

Let us trust primarily in the Good Lord's grace that this is His will and that He will support and sustain us in our efforts to maintain His house as well. The spirit of the congregation is affected if the condition of its house is not maintained.

We have seen the evidence of your generosity in the past when you have made contributions, and we hope you can help us again. We know that most of you are having a harder time these days as the economy worsens—less pay, smaller returns on retirement funds, higher bills—no matter what, these all require stricter budgeting. We would appreciate *any* amount you can give—large or small—with a glad heart. For this purpose, we are including a separate envelope in which to return your gift for the Roofing Fund. Please write the word "ROOF" on the envelope.

In the September newsletter we will publish the list of current donors. All the normal concerns and expenses of running the church continue; however, this special edition of the newsletter is being sent to enlighten everyone to the particular concerns over the roof. We trust in your loving help, and in God's abiding love and help to support all of our brothers and sisters, as well as this congregation.
